# Sometimes, it bites to be a toddler

Problem solving begins in our infants and develops through early childhood. Biting, hitting, and pushing are typical behaviors presented by infants, toddler, and 2-year-olds. As children mature, they are working to gain self-control, and to outgrow common problemsolving tactics that may be inappropriate and physical.

It is our job as parents and educators to better understand why these behaviors are happening, and how we can best help our children.

Why do children bite?

- Relieve pain from teething
- Explore cause and effect
- Act in self-defense
- Communicate needs
- Communicate difficult feelings
- Gain attention
- Feel in control

What can you do at home to help with these behaviors, and to prevent these behaviors?

- Have appropriate expectations for your toddler based on current skills.
- Create a consistent schedule, and routine. Children are able to thrive when they can predict what will happen next.

- Offer opportunities that release tension (i.e. bubbles, soft music, playdough).

- Help your child with language development. Prompt children to use the full word when speaking, and introduce descriptive words when talking with your toddler (i.e. "Can I use the blue ball").
- Utilize teething toys.
